#### **Additions to the Agenda**

B. Carino introduced Paul Romero, Associated Student of Cuyamaca College. There were no additions to the agenda.

#### **Army ROTC MOU with GCCCD**

J. Colson reported Lieutenant Colonel Kent Rideout requested the renewal of the Community College Formal Linkage Agreement with SDSU and Army ROTC. He asked DCEC members to take the agreement to their shared governance constituencies. Language from the past agreement is in our catalogs. The agreement would compel us to accept SDSU classes and to put holds on student accounts. There is some concern on items three and six of the agreement.

T. O'Hare stated we must transcript the courses and take them through the Curriculum Committee for approval. We would need the information ASAP to implement by the deadline in March. He had experience at another college with a similar military agreement and there were no issues. Ten to twenty students would get a nice stipend.

T. Pitt stated she is uncomfortable with this type of agreement as it may be a too close or invasive relationship giving them more opportunities to be on campus than other colleges. Accepting SDSU grades and putting holds on student accounts is a concern. There may be issues adding SDSU classes in Colleague. She asked that we request a copy of the original agreement from S. Topham.

B. Hertel stated the Presidents and Academic Senate Presidents should take this to their groups for review and approval. This agreement puts recruiting into a formalized program.

C. Hill agreed to take this to the Academic Senate.

S. Gonda stated the counselors would have the best chance to know the impact.

### **Military**

B. Hertel stated the military population in San Diego will significantly increase and we could look at strategies to attract them to our colleges.

### **Third Read BP 5200, AP/BP 5410, AP/BP 5420, AP 5520, AP/BP 5530**

B. Hertel explained there are several policies and procedures approved by DCEC waiting for answers to questions from DEC or further review from student government.

- BP 5210 Communicable Disease was approved earlier and is waiting for the AP to complete the third read. Both the AP and BP will be sent together to DEC.
- AP/BP 5300 Student Equity was sent to the Districtwide Student/Gender Equity Committee for review.
- AP/BP 5400 Associated Students/Associated Student Government Organization was sent to S. Barrett and A. Albarran for student government review and a title change.

T. Hankins asked why there is one student government policy for both colleges when ASGC and ASCC operate differently. J. Colson stated the District adopts policies to recognize student groups with some general parameters that cover both colleges.

Members reviewed the policies and procedures listed as third read and made the following changes:

- BP 5200 Student Health Services – members requested a change to the third paragraph to delete “shall establish” and replace with “will adhere to”, and to delete “necessary to ensure cooperation.”
- AP/BP 5410 Associated Student Government and Student Trustee Elections – members requested the AP language become the BP, and the BP language become the AP.
- AP/BP 5420 Associated Student Government Organization Finance – members asked for Associated Student Government review.
- AP 5520 Student Discipline Procedures – no changes
- AP/BP 5530 Student Rights and Grievances and Due Process – no changes

Members approved the following academic procedures and board policies to move to DEC with the above noted changes:

- BP 5200 Student Health Services
- AP/BP 5410 Associated Student Government and Student Trustee Elections
- AP 5520 Student Discipline Procedures

**Second Read AP 5210, AP/BP 5500, AP/BP 5550, AP/BP 5570, AP 5610**

Members reviewed the second read policies and procedures and made the following changes:

- AP 5210 Communicable Disease – T. Pitt will provide addition language stating students and staff will notify the Vice Presidents when there is an issue.
- AP/BP 5500 Standards of Student Conduct – members requested a review by J. Colson and S. Barrett. Correct the first paragraph of the BP to delete “imposition” and replace it with “implementation.”
- AP/BP 5550 Speech: Time, Place, and Manner – no changes.
- AP/BP 5570 Student Credit Card Solicitation – no changes.
- AP 5610 Voter Registration – no changes.

**First Read AP/BP 4020, AP/BP 4021, AP/BP 4230**

Members reviewed the first read policies and procedures and made the following comments:

- AP/BP 4020 Program and Curriculum Development – change policies to policy in heading
- AP/BP 4021 Program Discontinuance – spell out Board Policy in heading
- AP/BP 4230 Grading and Academic Record Symbols – the grading in this procedure was approved by the Academic Senates a few years ago and the catalogs need to be updated to match this procedure

C. Hill asked why our process is to read the policy and procedures at DCEC. J. Colson stated the other option would be to schedule a day to do this with all parties present.

**Status on Student Services and Academic Affairs Policies and Procedures**

J. Colson stated the review of student services policies and procedures are complete except for the A&R area.

C. Hill stated they are working to bring these forward.
