## More than 2,300 attend AlumniFest



More than 2,300 San Diego and Imperial County community college alumni attended AlumniFest March 11 at the Valley View Casino Center to see the San Diego Gulls hockey club beat the Bakersfield Condors 6-5 in sudden-death overtime.

A torrential downpour canceled the a pre-game party in the parking lot that was to feature face-painting, balloon artists,

and mascots from the community colleges in the area, but the Gulls organization was so pleased by ticket sales that it has invited event organizers to come back next year. The Foundation for Grossmont and Cuyamaca Colleges took the lead in organizing the event. John Valencia, associate vice chancellor of Advancement and Communications at the district and the foundation's CEO, said the number of tickets sold represents the most ever sold to a community college alumnirelated event in the region.
