A. Tuesday, April 8, 2025, Governing Board Regular Meeting Docket	The Chancellor reported that the AI workshop previously scheduled for the April 8th meeting has been postponed to the May 20th meeting due to the schedule of one of the board members. Item 6.1 Development of Consent Calendar – The Chancellor will note the following changes to the board docket made after posting: Item 10.1 was revised to remove two courses from Attachment C: BOT 086 and CA 105 Item 13.1 was revised to remove Dinah Heide Adye from the Approval/Ratification of New Appointments in Attachment A. Under the Human Resources category, the following was noted: NANCE positions may no longer be possible because of Personnel Commission rules. Methods of having similar types of employees are being explored with the Executive Director of the Personnel Commission. Student workers may be able to be used to backfill for some NANCE positions. Student Workers now only need to have 6 semester units to qualify for employment (and 3 in the summer), and do not have to be a student in this district; they can be a student at a different college or university and be a student worker here.
B. New Health and Safety Committee – Update	The Committee has met, and minutes are posted on the intranet.
C. Taskforce on Reimagining Public Safety – Update	Sahar reported that there were recommendations from the group to start exploring partnerships with other institutions for law enforcement.

	 The taskforce is evaluating what type of services the colleges want from CAPS. The composition of the taskforce was reviewed.
D. Governance Council Updates (Standing Item)	
IEPI Update Draft Governance Handbook	 It was explained that the Governance Handbook is a NEW document, not a revised document, since it has been completely overhauled. There is no track changes version since the document is new. Term limits for councils and committees will be considered at Governance Summit in August. The Governance Handbook should be finalized before summer break, as it needs to be approved ASAP. Feedback by the next DEC meeting on 5/19 would be appreciated.
Districtwide Budget Council (DBC)	DBC met on 3/26, and will meet after this meeting.
Human Resources Council (HRC)	 HRC met on 3/26. The charge and composition for the EEOAC were finalized, and they will be submitted in May for DEC review. The Office of Civil Rights in San Francisco is now closed Incorporating language from DEIA/Title 5 into job descriptions was discussed. HR will need to work with the constituent groups on this. AP 2710 Conflict of Interest was discussed, including dialogue about disclosure of outside employment. The Government Code does not allow "double-dipping." Employment cannot overlap between public agencies. HR is looking at language from other districts for consideration to include in our AP 2710.

	BP/AP 2710 Student Workers was discussed regarding new requirements discussed above under Item A.
Student and Institutional Success Council (SISC) ESSC Charge & Composition	 SISC met in March. A lot of work was done to get caught up with BP/APs. The final draft of the ESSC charge and composition was presented and reviewed. The District Common Course Number website is now up under "Student" sections. The new student attendance accounting method was discussed. The deadline for implementation of the new student attendance accounting method has been extended for one year. The Council's name will officially change from SISC to ESSC in the fall.
Technology Planning & Policy Council (TPPC)	 The Colleague/SQL refresh went well. There is now single sign-on. The help desks are busy with questions, as folks trying to figure out the new sign-on procedure. It is important to get our systems modernized. Our processes need to match current technology. Enrollment/financial aid fraud is still a huge problem. Barbara will send out an email to all faculty about checking attendance and doing cross-references to weed out fraudulent registrations. Updates to the charge and composition were reviewed and approved. TPPC is working on giving the Technology Operations Group (TOG) feedback on the rubric they use to rank and prioritize projects. The Artificial Intelligence (AI) Taskforce is being organized.
