	 Vice Chancellor Richerson reported that a new sentence has been added to the volunteer section identifying their activities to publicly clarify that volunteers do not supplant classified or faculty assignments or job duties. Several organizational modifications were presented for Cuyamaca College, District Services, Human Resources, and Grossmont College. It was noted that all changes are funded within existing departmental budgets.
	 14.2 Announcement of Intended Reappointment of the Governing Board Appointee to the Personnel Commission The Board will take action to announce its intent to reappoint Mr. Garrett as the District-appointed Personnel Commissioner. The final appointment will be made at the November meeting.
	14.3 Ratification of Agreement Between the American Federation of Teachers, Local 1931 (AFT) and the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District (GCCCD) • Vice Chancellor Richerson reported that
	the Board will ratify the agreement with AFT, which has already been ratified by over 90% of AFT members.



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	 The agreement results in net savings to the District.
	 15.1 Announcement of the Initial Proposal from California School Employees Association (CSEA), Chapter 707, to the District for 2025 Partial Reopener Negotiations The initial proposal from CSEA for partial reopener negotiations will be presented as an informational item. The District will bring its "sunshine" articles in November.
B. 2024-2025 Governance and Communication Effectiveness Survey Report – DEC Self-Survey	The Chancellor led a review of the DEC self- survey results and discussed key areas for improvement based on member feedback.
	 Adding a standing "open dialogue" or "roundtable" item to the end of agendas to foster more collaboration. Future DEC agenda items for consensus to include a record of which councils and committees Board Policies and Administrative Procedures have been reviewed by. The chairs of committees or task forces bringing items forward to be asked to present them to DEC to explain the background and process. A notification to be sent out when Board Policies and Administrative Procedures are finalized and approved. It was noted that consultant Debbie DiThomas is working with council chairs to review and potentially revise the survey instrument itself to gather more meaningful feedback. The Chancellor requested and encouraged DEC members to provide feedback and suggestions on the council's effectiveness and

Educational Support Services Council (ESSC)	Associate Vice Chancellor Gallego reported that the new council (formerly SISC) held its first meeting on September 22.
	They reviewed the council's charge and composition, discussed the new governance handbook, and clarified the review process for Board Policies (BPs) and Administrative Procedures (APs). – The council's priority for this year will be reviewing any BPs related to accreditation.
Technology Planning & Policy Council (TPPC)	Associate Vice Chancellor Gallego reported on behalf of Associate Vice Chancellor Kilber-Rebman.
	The council met on September 24, welcomed new members, and reviewed its charge.
	The co-chair of the AI task force provided an update on the task force's work.
	The District is officially launching the Accessibility Capability Maturity Model (ACMM) project to address state accessibility requirements.
	The California Virtual Campus (CVC) Exchange is now live, with seven student enrollments to date.
	The Chancellor noted that the Cabinet is preparing for a potential federal government shutdown to ensure there is no disruption of funding for students.



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Equity and Equal Employment Opportunity Advisory Committee (EEEOAC)	Colleen Moreno provided a brief review of the EEEOAC's last meeting in Vice Chancellor Richerson's absence.
	The committee reviewed changes to the hiring training, which will be renamed "EEO training."
	Sharon Sampson gave positive feedback on the new Vice Chancellor of Human Resources' collaborative approach.
