## **BP 4400** Community Services Programs

Reference: Education Code Section 78300; Title 5, Sections 55002, 55160(b); Board Policies 2410 and 2510

Adoption Date: December 18, 2001 Revised: Updated: November 19, 2019

The District may maintain a-community services and contract education program in civic, vocational, literacy, health, family and consumer sciences, technical and general education, including but not limited to classes in the fields of music, drama, art, handicraft, science, literature, nature study, nature contacting, aquatic sports and athletics that extends access to the District's services and facilities into the community by providing opportunities for citizens and organizations to participate in programs of intellectual and cultural pursuits, as well as opportunities to explore avocational interests. General fund monies will not be expended to establish and maintain community service or contract education courses. Students involved in community services courses shall be charged a fee not to exceed the cost of maintaining the courses. Courses may also be offered for remuneration by contract or with contributions or donations of individuals or groups via contract education.

Under the Civic Center Act, District facilities may be made available for use by recognized community groups and civic organizations when such use does not conflict with the regular educational or student service programs of the District.

The community services program shall be designed to contribute to the physical, mental, moral, economic, or civic development of the individuals or groups enrolled in it.

Community services courses shall be open for admission to adults and minors who can benefit from the programs.

No General fund monies may be expended to establish and maintain community service or contract education courses. Students involved in community services courses shall be charged a fee not to exceed the cost of maintaining the courses. Courses may also be offered for remuneration by contract or with contributions or donations of individuals or groups.
