BP 5402 Student Clubs and Organizations

Students shall be offered the opportunity to organize and participate in self-governing student clubs and organizations.

A college club or organization must be affiliated with and chartered by the Associated Student Government organization, and must have an advisor who is an employee of the District and approved by the college president. College clubs and organizations must comply with District and college policies and the Education Code governing student clubs and organizations.

Neither the District nor colleges act as legal agents for student clubs and organizations and expressly disclaim any and all responsibility or liability for their actions or obligations, contractual or otherwise. Registered student clubs and organizations do not officially represent the District or college with which they are identified. All views, actions, and obligations are the sole responsibility of the student organization.

Only registered and approved student clubs and organizations are authorized to use the name of the college with which they are affiliated to identify their organization. If the college name is used by registered and approved student organizations in communication off college campuses, the correspondence shall include the following phrase: Not an official agent of Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District or Grossmont/Cuyamaca College.
