BP/AP 3060 Institutional Code of Conduct – 6-Year Review

BP/AP 4250 Probation, Dismissal, and Readmission

- <u>Update:</u> A recommendation came from Cuyamaca's Student Success and Equity Council to pause the probation and dismissal process.
 - Barbara gave Grossmont a chance to review the request at their Student Success and Equity Council.
 - Barbara indicated the process is mandated to run by Title 5 and there is no relief from the state to not run the process. The loss of BOG process utilizes the probation and dismissal process to determine which student will lose their BOG.

Upcoming BP/APs – 6-Year Review

- <u>Updates:</u> Mike Williamson shared with Barbara that next year we will have one of the biggest legislative updates and numerous policies to review.
- <u>Notes:</u> The group asked that we create a streamlined process by which we keep track of all BP/APs.
- <u>Recommendation:</u> It was suggested that we use a spreadsheet and bring 4-5 policies to review at each SISC meeting.

4. Recommendations to SISC	 When a campus sends a request for a policy revision to SISC, Barbara would like to give the opportunity to the sister college to review with their constituents and provide feedback before bringing it to a meeting. It was suggested that we be mindful about the request's timeliness, as some policies may need to be reviewed with urgency.
5. 2023-2024 Student Health Services Maximum Fees (Aaron & Sara)	 Aaron presented the proposal to increase the Health Services Maximum Fee to the new max of \$26 for primary terms and \$22 for the summer term. It was determined that it was too late to increase the fees for the fall semester, given that registration was going to start the following Monday and fee increases need to be board approved. Barbara will work on a fee schedule so the group is aware of when increases in fees should come to SISC given that we are moving to a compressed calendar.
6. Multi-term Registration Update	A Project Discovery document was presented for the council to review.
