1) 2023-2024 BP/AP Goal Update Barbara shared that SISC reached 82% of the goal set In September to complete the review of 34 BP/APs – we approved 28! 2) Nonresident Tuition Barbara noted that the following legally required language was added to AP 5020, previously approved in April: “Citizens for the three (3) Freely Associated States (Federated State of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau) being charged in-state tuition rates, per Section 209 (b) (1) (E) of Title II of Division G of The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2024 (Public Law 118-42)” before submitting to DEC.

D. Informational & Operational Items	
1) Governance IEPI- Draft New Governance Council Barbara: Reviewed that in the IEPI SISC meeting it was identified that the council is too big and it is handling both Governance and Operational items. The recommendation is to develop two operational groups – Instructional and Student Services, and a governance council. In working with the IEPI Consultant and meeting with the college VP's, the Educational Support Services Council (ESSC) was developed as the new governance group. The operational groups are in the works. The ESSC draft charge, composition, and flow chart, including operational groups, were reviewed and discussed with the below highlights. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• BP's are governance items and AP's are operational.• Concern of BP's and AP's being reviewed separately, recommendation to reverse the work flow process and review AP's first. Barbara will explore option over the summer, for updates that are not legally required.• Operational groups will share AP's with proposed governance council.• Responsibility of constituency groups to communicate and review policies.• Apprehension that communication flow may not be manageable with impact of time on agendas.• Barbara to consider holistically, how the District Governance Councils are going to work the College Councils. Bri noted this would be appreciated as the district governance does not currently have a connection to college governance.
