District gets another high mark for bond transparency



For the third year in a row, the college district's bond program has gotten high marks from the San Diego Taxpayers Education Foundation for transparency about Proposition V, the bond approved by East County taxpayers in 2012. The District received an "A" from the taxpayers association, scoring 96 out of 100 points for its website information and reporting and

audit information. In 2016, the district received a perfect score, and received a 96 out of 100 in 2015, the first year the scorecard was issued. The high scores reflect the district's efforts to be open with East County taxpayers so they can be confident the bond money is being spent properly.


CPR training offered to District employees

Workday Updates

District employees can now use Workday off-campus for a variety of tasks, including checking their vacation balances, requesting time off, or posting sick leave. A multi-factor authentication system, in which a text or voice message is sent to a telephone, provides additional
