CORPORATE COLLEGE 2017 SUMMARY

The Grossmont-Cuyamaca Corporate College, now in its 4th year of operation under District Services, continues to support CTE departments and the business community by offering not-for-credit coursework to workers both on and off campus.

Classes include short-term certifications that complement for-credit degree programs as well as re-certifications needed for local employees to stay compliant and keep their jobs. Class topics given in 2017 included hazardous waste awareness and transportation, California Advanced Lighting Controls training, and Smog update courses, all of which fall under high-demand, environmentally-friendly “green” careers in the region.

In 2017, Corporate College served students from 23 local employers, including the following high profile companies: US Navy, Polypeptide Labs, Neurocrine Biosciences, Sharp Healthcare, Spawar, TSA, Metro Transit Systems, Northrup Grumman, County of San Diego, Layfield Environmental, UTC Aerospace, and the Port of San Diego, among others.

In 2017, Corporate College grossed \$96,354 and awarded 550 certificates, all of which is coordinated by Program Manager Erin Roberts.
