
Return of Women's Basketball

Student Tools for the Election



Political Science Professor Josh Franco has provided students a framework to analyze a congressional district election. His article was published online in September's issue of Political Science Now, the national online news publication for the American Political Science Association. Additionally, Franco's work has been widely shared on social media.

Franco suggests that analyzing congressional district elections, or any other state legislative or statewide election, can be made easier by using a five-part framework: geography, voter data, candidates, issues, and polling.

Dr. Franco is a first-generation college graduate who is a tenure-track, assistant professor of political science at Cuyamaca College. Additionally, he has five years of professional experience work in the California State Capitol and U.S. Congress.

Josh Franco to Serve on Statewide Curriculum Workgroup

Dr. Josh Franco has been invited to serve on the Intersegmental Curriculum Workgroup as part of his work with the Course Identification Number System (C-ID). C-ID addresses the need for common course number across all colleges and universities to facilitate identification of comparable courses and increase articulation across US, CSU, and CCC systems. The invitation positions Dr. Franco and the college at the forefront of curricular innovation.

Omar E. Montaño, adjunct art professor and visual artist, currently has work on view in a virtual/online exhibition at The Monterey Museum of Art. The exhibition, *Omar E. Montaño in *Virtual* Currents*, features linoleum block prints inspired by the *Undersea World of Jacques Cousteau* documentaries. The footage provided source material used in creating each composition. The prints celebrate the work of Cousteau, and explore the quality of ocean stewardship since the mid-1970s.

Montaño received a BA in studio art from San Diego State University and a MFA from the Academy of Art University in San Francisco. He teaches 2-Dimensional Design, Drawing, or Art Appreciation at San Diego Miramar and Cuyamaca Colleges.
