El Cajon, CA – Cuyamaca College's Student Services Center has been included among over 300 buildings world-wide, awarded with the prestigious 2024 American Architecture Awards® for the best new buildings designed and constructed by American architects in the U.S. and abroad, and by international architects for buildings designed and built in the United States. The new Cuyamaca College Student Services Center and Administration Complex was awarded not only for its beauty, but for providing new and renovated welcoming spaces for both students and members of the community. Most importantly, it serves as a central hub for Cuyamaca College student services at the entrance to campus.
