Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District

Overview

Since 1961, the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District has enhanced the quality of East County life by providing a top notch, affordable education. The 1,138-square-mile district includes two colleges, Grossmont and Cuyamaca. Increasingly, flexible class schedules and learning opportunities are providing a wide range of education options for busy people.

The District serves more than 21,000 students each semester. Grossmont first convened classes in 1961 and has about 15,900 students every semester. Cuyamaca was built in 1978 and has more than 8,800 students. The colleges lead the way in developing educational programs, classes and services that meet the needs of the community of learners.

The colleges each offer more than 150 degree and certificate programs. More than 3,600 degrees and certificates were awarded at Grossmont College, while more than 1,700 degrees and certificates were awarded at Cuyamaca College.

The colleges offer short-term classes (four, six or eight weeks), open entry-open exit, on-line and blended courses, Saturday courses, and contract education. The many options available contribute to why surveys show that three out of every four East County residents has taken classes at Cuyamaca or Grossmont colleges.






Employee Gender

Cuyamaca College

Overview

Cuyamaca College, built in 1978, provides transformational educational opportunities whether the student is just starting college, planning to transfer to a university, returning to launch a career or to pick up new skills. One out of every three East County adults have taken classes at Grossmont or Cuyamaca colleges. Cuyamaca College serves the East San Diego County communities of Alpine, Crest, Dehesa, El Cajon, Jamul, Lakeside, La Mesa, Lemon Grove, Rancho San Diego, Santee, Spring Valley and beyond to the Imperial County and Mexican borders.

Cuyamaca College plays a key role in the community and in regional economic development.

- Cuyamaca College was awarded a federal \$2.6 million five-year Title V Hispanic Serving Institution grant to raise achievement for Hispanic students and expand their educational opportunities.
- Cuyamaca College has an agreement with Point Loma Nazarene University to offer bachelor's degree programs in Child Development and Organizational Management without leaving the college campus.
- Cuyamaca College is offering accelerated math and English classes that reduce the amount of remedial classes students must take. The college received a \$1.5 million state grant to expand this effort.
- Cuyamaca College was one of 20 California community colleges that was selected to participate in a project to develop guided pathways that lead students toward a degree, certificate or transfer to a four-year university.
- The Water Conservation Garden and the Heritage of the Americas Museum are both based at Cuyamaca College.






Employee Gender




